

GETTING READY FOR A NEW SCHOOL YEAR

In preparing for the 2021-2022 school year, it's helpful to get your child back on a regular bedtime schedule before school begins so they are adjusted to getting up early when school starts.

School begins promptly at **9:25 a.m. each day**, and being on time and at school is absolutely critical to your child's success in school.

If your student arrives to school after 9:25 a.m., they will need to check in with the office for a tardy pass.

AFTER SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION NOTES

Please email your students' teacher AND <u>kendalls@rsd407.org</u> (Stephanie Kendall, SW Attendance Registrar) if your student will be leaving school early or going home via a different mode.

It is very important that both the teacher AND the office are informed.

We will write a pass and give it to your student that day.

Please also use first and last names and teacher name on the notes.

If you call the office 425-844-4750, please call before 2:00 on a regular school day and 12:30 on an early release Friday so we can be sure your student will get a pass from the office.

A NOTE FROM NURSE CORTNEY



People with COVID-19 have a wide range of symptoms reported-ranging from very mild symptoms to severe illness. We cannot assume that mild symptoms are the result of the common cold or allergies.

Please keep your child home if they have any of the following:

- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Headache
- Nausea or vomitina
- Diarrhea
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Fever or chills
- New loss of taste or smell



If you keep your child home sick, please contact the front office and share any symptoms your child is having. We will follow up with guidance about when your child may return to school. If your child is out for a family reason or appointment, let us know that as well so we know they are safe to return.

All students will need to wear a properly fitting mask and have two spares in their backpacks.


You will NOT need to complete a Skyward attestation this year.

KINDER CORNER

This section is specifically for our newest Stillwater Soaring Hawks.

You will LOVE Kindergarten!

Children will make new friends, learn mountains of new things, and experience all the joys of the Stillwater Elementary Community.
Children (and parents) are understandably often a bit nervous before Kindergarten starts. You are putting your child in good hands with expert staff!

Here are some commonly asked questions:

- 1. The school is much bigger than preschool (or home, or aunt's house, etc.). How will my child know how to find the cafeteria/playground/bathroom? Each Kindergarten classroom is very close to a bathroom. All Kindergarteners will go to lunch and recess together, and their teachers and staff will carefully guide them to where they need to be. There is a lot of adult supervision in the hallways, in the cafeteria, and on the playground. Your child may eat hot lunch or bring a lunch.
- 2. Where will my child start each day? All students will start each day lining up in the back of the school. If your child is eating breakfast, there are tables to sit at and eat in the cafeteria.
- 3. My child is riding the bus. I'm a little nervous about this. Please make sure you know which bus your child should be on and that there is someone at the bust stop every day to drop them off and pick them up. Transportation cannot allow a Kindergartner to be dropped off with no adult present. Teachers walk their class out to the bus each day. Masks are required on the bus, too.
- 4. What if my child gets sick or injured at school? We have Nurse Cortney here full- time and daily clinic assistance available to deal with illness/injury. Classroom teachers are notified of any health conditions/allergies. The clinic is located in the main office. If your child is sick or injured you will be notified by phone. Sick students need to be kept home.

Weapons

State Law (RCW 28A-600.420 and School District Policy 3200 prohibit the possession of firearms and weapons at school. This law pertains to guns, knives, clubs, firecrackers, and explosives. Dangerous weapons also include toy or "dummy" or look-alike objects. The full text of the law and the definitions of dangerous weapons, as provided RCW9.41.250 and RCW 9.41.280, are on file in the school office. Possession of firearms on school property will result in a one year mandatory expulsion, subject to appeal with notification to parents and law enforcement. Any violations of these guidelines by students constitutes grounds for expulsion from the Riverview School District and the public schools of the State of Washington and Board Policy.

Nondiscrimination
